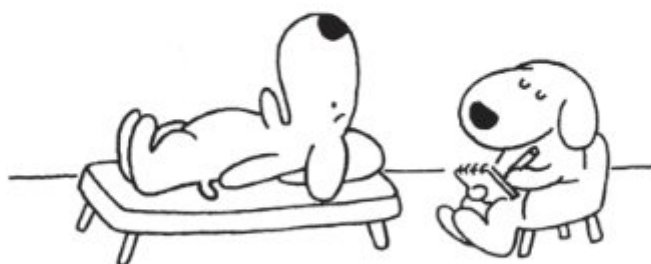

The cartoons are humorous, droll and the dog is always straight-faced but I enjoyed them all. The format is the problem in the iPhone kindle version: sometimes the words that explain the cartoon are not on the page with the cartoon but on the next page above a different cartoon.

Hurrah for Charles Barsotti! This man has one flaw: he is no longer alive. His cartoons are not only funny (which cannot be said of all New Yorker cartoons, or maybe I'm just dumb) but they are very endearing, and move laughter from the ground of cynicism to that of sympathy.

Want to feel warm and fuzzy and happy? Just turn the pages, smile a lot and fall in love with all the pups. Dog Owners, do you sometimes wonder what your dog REALLY feels or thinks under all sorts of circumstances? The answers are here, page after page. You and your pet'll become even closer because you'll have gained a special degree of understanding thanks to Barsotti's wonderful talent. So sad for all of us that we lost him this year.

I'd recommend this book to anyone who's ever loved a dog, been amazed by their intelligence, or comforted by their presence in any situation! Charles Barsotti can make you laugh from all angles...my favorites are the puppy oriented ones since I'm escorting a Cavachon thru his first year (or he's escorting me thru my 56th year, I'm not sure). Barsotti's cartoons are fabulous, but the eBook is poorly formatted so that captions for cartoons sometimes don't appear on the same page as the cartoon, or sometimes appear over a different cartoon.
