

Enjoy the book but it is GP rating. Was intending to give to my Grandson, but not at this tender age.

Beware this book if you are actually looking for the true stories behind the constellations. I bought this for a research project for my child only to be dismayed when each story is the author's retelling only loosely based on the original stories. Nowhere in the description is this disclaimed, and now my child still has no research book and I have to start looking again. Very, very disappointed.

I found this in a local bookstore and it was exactly what I was looking for...a kind of anthology of mythological stories of the constellations in the sky. Although there are illustrated constellations, it's not the kind of star atlas that shows you how to find Messier objects, planets, or other astronomical features with your telescope or binoculars--be aware of what you're getting. For me, this was a great book to use to get familiar with the stories behind the stars and then head out to the backyard with my son for a "campfire-like" storytelling session. The stories (and some poetry) are laid out on a page or two, while the image depicting the constellation (artist illustration) is on the facing page. I

absolutely love it!

I read this for research while trying to get better acquainted with star myth. Though the short stories in this book didn't provide as much of an academic perspective as I expected, I was delighted that these humorous, random interpretations of the stars really did stick with me so that for the first time, I really could trace constellations in the sky!

Probably-no definitely one of the coolest books I own! It's visually pleasing and has tons of interesting facts and info on the stars in our sky!
