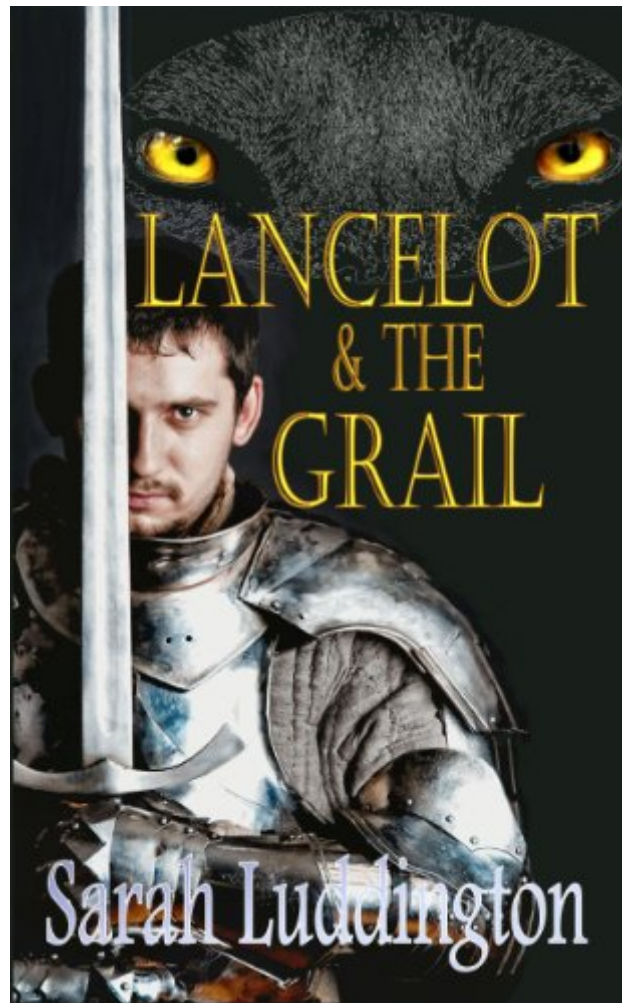


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Lancelot And The Grail (The Knights Of Camelot Book 3)



Synopsis

By the time I read this book I was hooked on this series! I am a kindle reader and I went and purchased the rest of the books that Sarah Luddington had written as of this date in the Knights of Camelot series (up to book 7). This book opens with Lancelot being totally broken and hiding away in the wild woods. His mind has broken from what has happened at the end of Lancelot and the Grail. He is living as shell of his former self off the land to still the ghosts of those he has killed through the years in service to his king. When he is called back to Camelot it is more than he can bear, can he do it. Can he face the challenges ahead? Of course he can. This is truly turning into an epic work. This is becoming one of my favorite series. I can't recommend it enough.

It is very well written - the language is of a higher standard than one usually encounters in these type of books. There are very few grammatical and/or spelling errors, for which I was very happy, being an English teacher, as those errors really minimise my enjoyment of a book. The story itself is refreshing, in that it acknowledges that section of the population, which is usually reviled or completely ignored and made to disappear in history and oral stories. The plot itself is excellent, as it does not rely solely on the usual Arthurian stories, but includes many different elements, leavened with a good imagination and humour.
