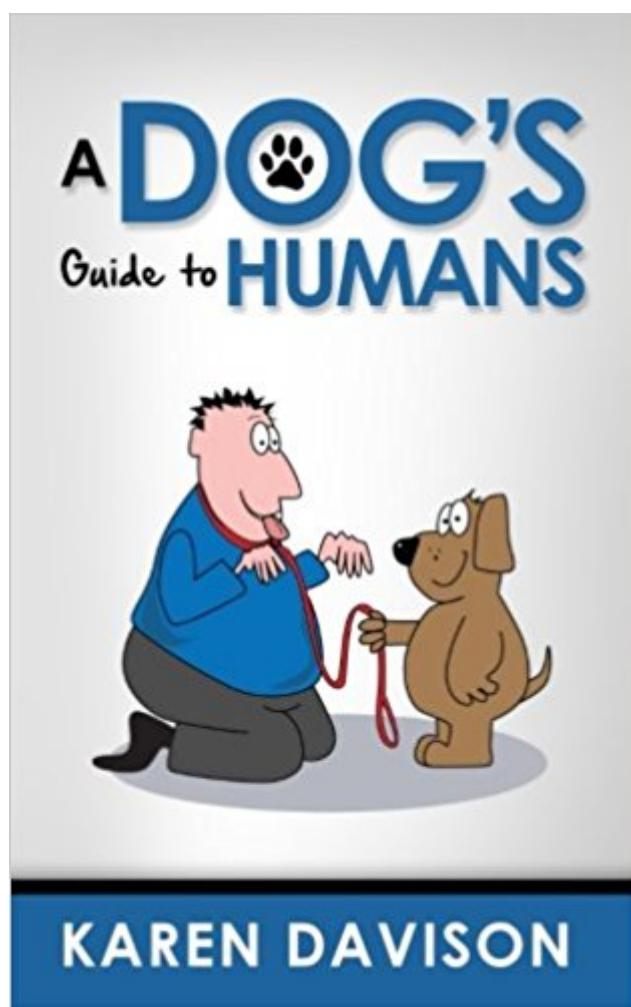

Karen Davison grew up in Bedfordshire, England. She has been both an avid reader and a lover of animals since early childhood. When she was eight, she got her first dog, Scamp, whose great character started Karen's lifelong devotion to dogs. Since qualifying in Canine Psychology in 2001, she has worked as a professional dog trainer and canine behaviourist. Going on to study Wolf Ecology in 2009 she was lucky enough to spend time with wolves at the UK Wolf Conservation Trust, Reading. Her first publication, The Perfect Companion: Understanding, Training and Bonding with your Dog, a comprehensive guide to canine psychology, training and problem solving, was published in June 2012 and won an IndiePENDants award for quality. Since then she has published The Complete Guide to House Training Puppies and Dogs, Companion Huskies: Understanding, Training and Bonding with your Dog, and two Fun Reads for Dog Lovers: It Shouldn't Happen to a Dog Trainer and A Dog's Guide to Humans. She

is in the process of developing the next title in the series 'A Dog's Guide to Cats'; and having enormous fun doing it! After joining a local writers group, she has spread her author wings and is now enjoying writing poetry and short stories. After taking a course in screenwriting has just completed her first radio drama script 'The Other Woman'. Karen is also working on a novel, which combines her love of writing, wolves and fantasy - 'Wolf Clan Rising' which is due to be published 2017. Karen resides in a cottage on the west coast of Ireland, drawing inspiration for writing from the peace and beauty of her surroundings where she shares her life with her husband, two daughters and nine special needs pets. Her seven rescue dogs and two rescue cats have a mixture of emotional, behavioural and physical disabilities. One of Karen's favourite sayings: 'Saving one dog will not change the world, but surely for that one dog, the world will change forever.'

With as much detailed information in the book, I'm shocked that it made its way into human hands. It serves as an excellent reference on dealing with behavior issues (only feeding you dog food, not letting you sleep on the bed and of course, putting you in an outside doghouse). It provides detailed information on how humans dress (i.e their "paw coverings") to where they keep their best food and how to get it on demand, as well as being at your beck and call. The guide is also an introduction to yes-cats and how to deal with them. There is another in-depth guide strictly devoted to dealing with cats. This is a must read for every dog.

Karen Davison really knocks it out of the park with 'A Dog's Guide to Humans'. While it is written in a humorous and engaging style, this book focuses on the relationship between a loving dog owner and their pet. Building on that relationship in a positive way means a happier dog and a happier you.
