

This is an extraordinary story of heroism and love. The central figure is a vibrant character who loved life and wanted to know and understand as much of it as she could. Her childhood and years of growing up as a first-generation Chinese American in the United States were themselves remarkable, marked by sacrifice and great achievement on the part both of herself and her

parents. As a young woman, she became a world traveler, visiting Europe, Latin America, and Asia. Her tours of Spain, Portugal, Morocco, Turkey, Iran, Pakistan, Afghanistan, China, Russia, and India are noteworthy. In India she visited Delhi, Bombay, Calcutta, Kashmir, and Amritsar, site of the magnificent Golden Temple, the holiest shrine of the Sikhs. Through a cruel twist of fate, she suffered a terrible accident in her second trip to Mexico, in 1978, and became a paraplegic. She did not give in to despair, however, but continued to live a full life. Following the accident, she met and married her husband, a Caucasian American of varied European ancestry.
