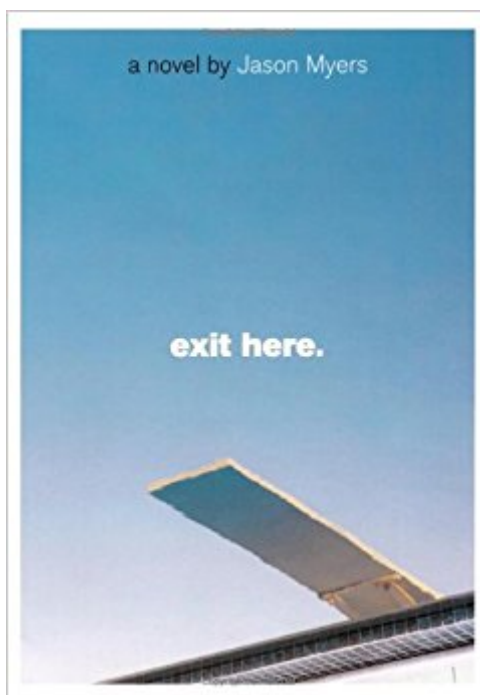

The twist at the end, rather the multiple turns and conclusions the author takes make the novel worth the read. 3. I really despised the protagonist. I kept finding illusions to *Catcher in the Rye* - rather where this novel could have gone in a different direction and meant more. Do I recommend it, no. Was it worth

finishing, yes. That is all.

I didn't live an Exit Here. life but someone close to me did. This book connects with a place in my heart that has never been seen before. I am selfish with this novel because it peeled back my layers and made me realize how decisions so greatly form our future. I placed my copy on shelf and from time on time I will glance at it and think about how it changed my life perception.

The style of writing will take some getting used to b/c there are no quotation marks...that means you don't know if the narrator is thinking or speaking unless another character responds to him. There are a lot of drugs in this book as well.

I left this sitting at an airport terminal when I was finished with it. Wasn't really sure what to think at the end. I hated the first half and then felt some compulsion to read all the way through. By the end I had no real feelings about it at all.

This is possibly the rawest book I've come across since Chad Kultgen's "The Average American Male". It's an accurate description of hipster life in the midwest and keeps you on the edge of your seat. Looking forward to reading more of Myers' work.
