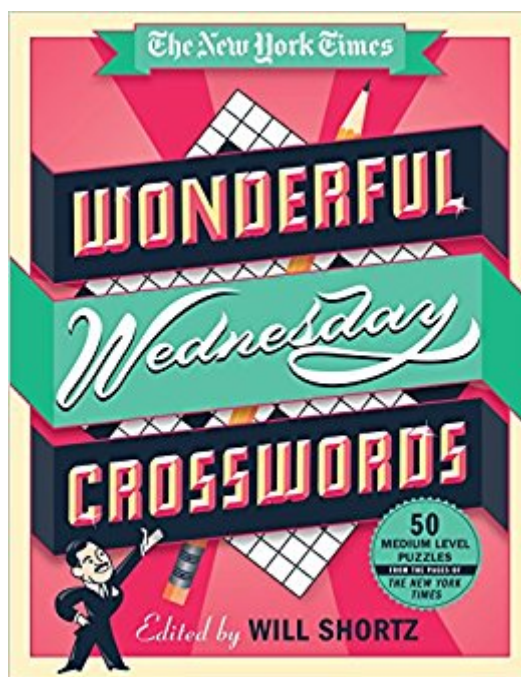

Will Shortz has been the crossword puzzle editor of The New York Times since 1993. Mr. Shortz founded both the American Crossword Puzzle Tournament, where he serves as director, and the World Puzzle Championship, where he is the captain of the U.S. team. He is the current Puzzlemaster for "Weekend Edition Sunday" on National Public Radio.

Of the 50 puzzles only about half a dozen are acceptable crosswords in the traditional sense. The rest are allegedly "contemporary," a term invented to cover Google-assisted mass-produced crosswords containing lengthy ridiculous and meaningless wordplay sentences with the rest of the

blanks filled by Google-search results often being either extremely rare words, arbitrary abbreviations (the first three letters of any word constitute an abbreviation!) or even non-existent words desperately used to finish the puzzle, let alone foreign language words. The puzzles are described as "medium level" but in reality they are "extremely hard level" since to know some of the words one needs to be a senior scholar and at the same time expert in rappers and other pop culture icons.

Wednesday puzzles are about half as difficult as the monster Sunday ones, and about the limit of my crosswording ability. But after finishing these, I might just graduate to the next level.
