


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# The Marriage Of Heaven And Hell (Oxford Paperbacks)

William Blake (1757-1827) was an English poet, painter, and printmaker.

Since this is a fairly serious work, the mandated choices regarding plot, mood, pace and characters really don't apply. Since groups together all reviews of books with the same title, the one to get is edited by Michael Phillips. Mr Phillips has spent almost a lifetime studying William Blake and carefully presents his insight as well as differences in various editions of the book. To appreciate this book, one has to take into account the political and religious turmoil when it was written. Mr Phillips gives a lot of background to help understand the era.
