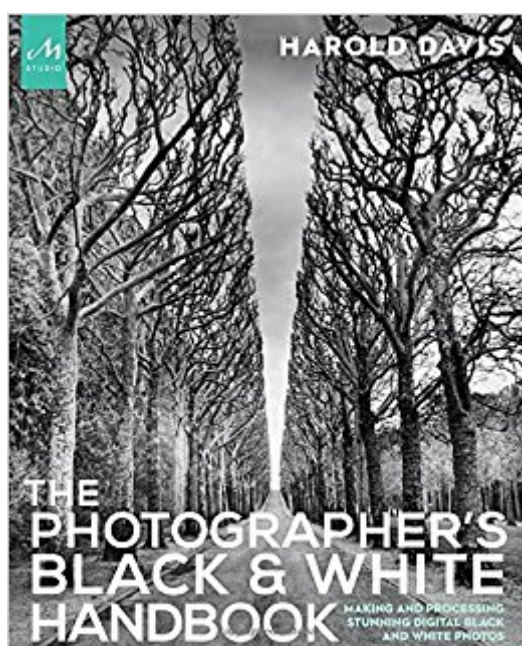

I think the author knows that B&W is very subjective. I myself have spent hours fine tuning a B&W image only to have someone find it wasn't a pleasing image to them. Great book and tool for B&W photography

There is a characteristic that sets B&W photography apart from color imagery. Where the eye is drawn by color into an image and certain regions of the spectrum evoke different emotions in the viewer, the black and white photograph relies on the contrast between light and dark to create the

same impression. As Harold Davis emphasizes, the B&W composition, processing and artistic practices demand a different eye from the maker of the images and he does an excellent job of walking the reader through each of these aspects. The

The Photographer's Black and White Handbook: Making and Processing Stunning Digital Black and White Photos is a worthwhile read for anyone who is beyond selecting the B&W in-camera option and who wants to create the artistry that these types of photographs are known for. I love that he uses a series of images from places such as Japan and France to illustrate the topic of each chapter, from composing the image and looking for the contrasting light to the digital conversion process. You can linger in the composition chapters for a long time enjoying the images but also daydreaming about places within your reach the next weekend to build your own library. Davis provides a mountain of step-by-step information about the ideal work-flow for converting native RAW images into the stunning photos that you are imagining when you press the shutter button. While he has his favorite tools, Davis takes an agnostic approach in detailing the use of both of Adobe's major processing tools. He is also helpful in pointing out the strengths of a range of plugin tools that can bring new processing options to work on your images. This is a beautiful book that you will enjoy as much for the travelogue writing and images as you will for the excellent instruction.
