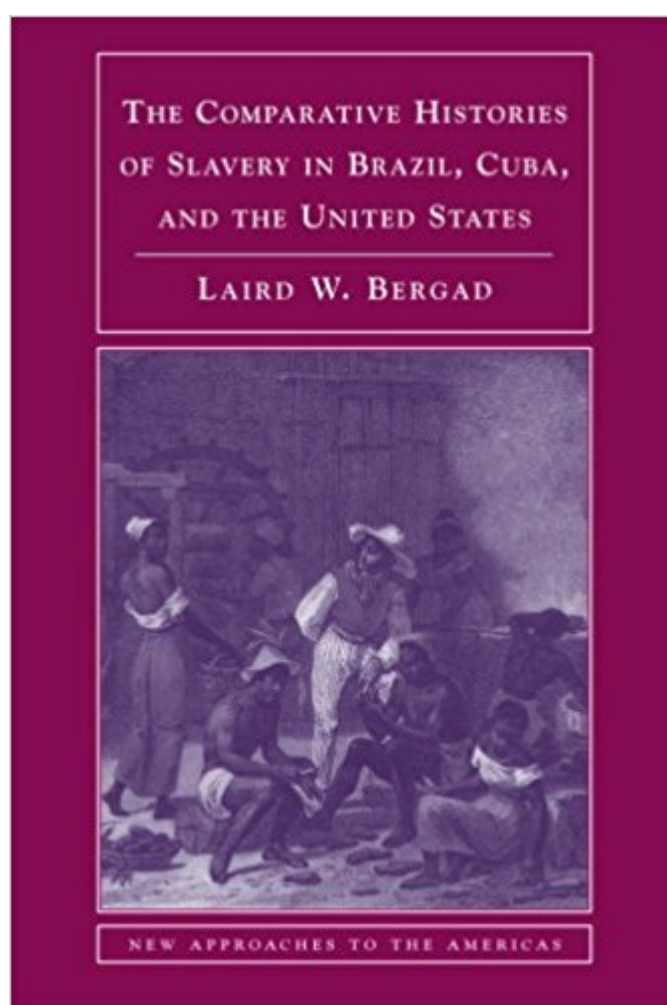


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The Comparative Histories Of Slavery In Brazil, Cuba, And The United States (New Approaches To The Americas)

systemically surveys slavery in Brazil, Cuba, and the United States from comparative perspectives. Chapters focus on slave narratives, demography, economy, culture, resistance and rebellion, and the causes of abolition.

Prior to reading this I didn't know how important Cuba was to the Atlantic trade. Learning about the law and manumission opportunities available in Cuba and Brazil was eye opening. The author clearly explains the extremely restrictive laws of the United States.
