

When I was asked to do a Sunday School class on Martin Luther in a non-Lutheran Church, this book proved to be a godsend. This book opened up Luther's theology for me and helped me grasp

and explain both the man and his theology. The author is an unabashed Lutheran, but he opens up the subject clearly and with humor so clearly set forth the man and what he believed. The book was a delight to read, and I found it very useful.

I was disappointed in this book. I lead an adult study group at my church, and we found this book to be difficult to understand. The author goes into involved explanations of concepts such as righteousness, original sin, and justification by faith. He uses unfamiliar terms such as tropes and makes reference to prior thinkers such as Aristotle and Augustine. I was hoping for a portrait of Luther's career as well as his ideas, but we did not find that in this book. We have read other books in the armchair series and found them informative and easy to understand.
