

JOHN EDWARD WEEMS was a freelance writer, and the author of ten books, including *A Weekend in September*.

I would not have put the reading level of this at 2nd grade. You are probably going to need to read it to them. Seems to be friendly story telling for a younger child and lots of appropriate illustrations, but I don't think most second graders will be reading this to themselves. Breaking it down into shorter chapters with chapter titles would have helped. So truthfully, the lack of extra stars has more to do with the deceptive description and not the book itself. There also seems to be an issue with the glue, the front cover is pull back from where it's glued together. The pages look like they will hold together

well enough but the cover may come off.

This is a great starting place for the grandkids to learn the history of the great state of Texas. I can't wait to start reading this with them.

Poorly written.

Originally written as four individual books given out with McDonald's Happy Meals in 1986, during the Texas Sesquicentennial, this is a good book to introduce elementary age children to Texas history. The author has many books of Texas and American history written for an adult/older child audience, including A Weekend in September, about the Galveston Storm of 1900.

This book was written for elementary students and is full of wonderful illustrations. It is a comprehensive overview of Texas history from the Ice Age to the sesquicentennial year of 1986.

This is an elementary Texas history book, for young kids. Not appropriate for a college student! Very displeased this was not made clear!
